### .aero Scope

- Specific Internet domain space for the entire aviation community
- Fulfil community and customers requirements
- Secure and reliable industry domain space
- Expect a reduced number of domain disputes within the closed community





### What is .aero?

- Special purpose and restricted TLD
- Doesn't compete with ".com" or other TLDs
- Addressed to the entire aviation community(AC)
  - Adopts international industry standards
  - Adds value to the use of Internet by the community
- Promotes B2C, B2B and B2E
  - Improves the efficiency and security of air transport
  - Enhances customer service






## Industry Benefits

- Brand protection
- Reliable service controlled by, and for the AC
  - Screening process (prevents cyber-squatting)
  - Community supervision
- Effective name structure enabled
  - Easy customer identification (ba.aero, jfk.aero)
  - Structured domain name space
  - Interline communications
- Improves reliability, safety and security
  - B2B/B2C services






## Integrating the AC







### .aero Organization







### Sponsor and DAC

- Ensures to benefit the entire aviation community and its customers
- Ensures stability and registry process are maintained
- Ensures registry services meet the expectations of its customers





### Partners (DAC Members)

- IATA (International Air Transport Association)
- ICAO (International Civil Aviation Organization)
- ACI (Airports Council International)
- SITA (Société Internationale de Télécommunications Aéronautique)
- Aerospace AECMA (European Association of Aerospace Industries) and other regional organizations





### .aero Policy

- Domain Management Policy is defined in co-ordination with the community
  - Conventions and policies
  - Validation process (authentication)
- Adopts I CANN policies in the context that will not interfere with AC competence
  - Charter eligibility (CEDRP)
  - Entry point level (EPLDR)
  - UDRP
  - ICANN Registrar Criteria


## Naming Convention (1)


- Distinctive and appropriate convention is set according to specific industry sectors
  - recognises aviation industry conventions and designators (airlines, airports, aerospace)
- Priority is given to community standards, aviation industry designators and trademarks





## Naming Convention (2)







### 2-character Airline Designator Codes

- SITA requested ICANN & GAC, the use IATA twoletter airline designator codes as SLD identifiers
  - e.g. ba.aero, af.aero, sr.aero, 1b.aero
- I SO Maintenance Agency Secretariat approved the request
- Conditions of the approval
  - valid during the term of the ICANN-SO Agreement
  - the two letter combinations shall not be used in a manner which is inconsistent with the ISO 3166 Maintenance Agency Secretariat's Alpha-2 code elements

### **Registration Validation**

- Performed by selected industry associations
  - associations enforcing rigorous membership criteria
- Validation criteria is according to specific industry sectors (airlines, airports, etc)
- Applicants must provide evidence and membership identity, to selected associations
- Refuse and/or remove registrations at any time if validation criteria is violated





### Restrictions

- Non-members of the aviation community stated in the charter
- Non-members of accredited associations need a more severe validation process





## Start-up plan

- Phase 0 (day 1)
  - Domain names Reservation
- Phase1 trademarks and aviation codes (4 months)
  - Aviation industry designators
  - Airlines and airports (2 and 3-character designators)
  - Civil Aviation authorities (DGCAs)
  - Aerospace
  - Eligible members of the community
- Phase 3 Normal operation





### Major Milestones

#### 4Q 2001 - Conclusion of

- Agreement Sponsorship (ICANN)
- Advisory body implementation (DAC)
- Domain Management Policy
- IQ 2002
  - Ramp up period
  - Registration services launch
